

St. Casimir's Church Scene of Wedding Today

St. Casimir's church was the scene of a wedding at 9 o'clock this morning when Miss Frances Irene Zalewski, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Peter C. Zalewski, 4523 24th Ave., was married to Eligio C. Pierangeli. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ladislao Pierangeli, 5105 22nd Ave., The main altar, before which the Rev. Alex Waligorski stood to officiate at the nuptial mass, was decorated with pink and white peonies. Only the immediate families witnessed the ceremony for which the church choir provided the wedding music.

This evening a wedding dinner will be served at the D.A.V., and later the two will receive 300 guests at the same place before leaving on a wedding trip to northern Wisconsin and Canada. When they return they will make their home at 5105 22nd Ave. In September they will move to Madison where both will attend the University of Wisconsin.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of white slipper satin. The bodice was outlined in scallops and the lace yoke was trimmed with seed pearls. The skirt cascaded into a three yard train and her veil of silk illusion was finger-tip in length and was held by a Queen's crown of lace and seed pearls. She held a cascade of white roses centered by an orchid.
